Nutty About Fruitcake

Some people hate it, some love it and others love to make jokes about it! Fruitcake has a long history and is a popular holiday treat in many parts of the world.

Today's fruitcake is a sweet, dense loaf made with butter, brown sugar and molasses, and lots of nuts and candied fruits, among other ingredients. The first fruitcakes, however, were a little different.

The oldest reference to a similar cake dates to Roman times. The recipe included barley mash mixed with pomegranate seeds, pine nuts and raisins, producing a portable, long-lasting food that was perfect for travelers.

During the Middle Ages, dried fruits became more widely available, so people added them to cakes, along with honey and spices.

In the 1500s, cheap sugar from the colonies began arriving in Europe, and it was soon discovered that soaking fruit in successively greater concentrations of sugar intensified the color and flavor, while also acting as a preservative. Soon fruitcakes were all the rage.

Serving fruitcake for special occasions such as holidays and weddings became popular in the 18th and 19th centuries, especially in Great Britain.
