Facts About Idaho!

- The name "Idaho" is derived from a Native American word that means "the land of many waters."
- Because there are over 72 different types of gemstones found in Idaho, its nickname is the "Gem State."
- Idaho grows an estimated 1/3 of America's potatoes.
- The longest gondola ride in the world is located at Silver Mountain Resort in Kellogg, Idaho.
- Emma Edwards Green designed Idaho's state seal.
 It is the only state seal designed by a woman.
- Idaho's capitol building is the only state capitol in the United States that is heated using geothermal water.
- A person standing on Heaven's Gate Lookout in Idaho can see Washington, Montana, and Oregon.
- Idaho is larger than all of New England combined (Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island).
- Eruptions at Idaho's Craters of the Moon National Monument occur every 2,000 years. The last eruptions happened 2,000 years ago.
- Shoshone Falls, near Twin Falls, Idaho, plummets 212 feet (65 meters). Its nickname is the "Niagara of the West."

- The state horse of Idaho is the Appaloosa, and Idaho was the first state to offer a license plate featuring a state horse.
- Idaho has 9,322,000 acres of roadless wilderness, more than any other state except Alaska.
- Sun Valley was the first ski resort in the world to use chairlifts.
- Boise is the capital and largest city in Idaho. The name "Boise" is a French word meaning "wooded."
- Hells Canyon in Idaho is 7,900 feet (2,400 meters) deep, which is deeper than the Grand Canyon.
- Between 1861 and 1866, it is believed that gold seekers found \$20 million in gold dust and nuggets during the Idaho gold rush.
- The largest population of Basque people in the United States lives near Boise.
- Idaho relocated beavers into the wilderness by dropping them out of airplanes with parachutes in the 1940s.
- In 1914, the United States
 Postal Service banned
 sending people through the
 mail after a 4-year-old was
 mailed across the state
 of Idaho.
- The largest sand dune in America is in Idaho's Bruneau Dunes State Park.
