

It's Not Just for Halloween Anymore

National Candy Corn Day is Oct. 30. But while this candy is the best-known Halloween treat, it's not just for trick-or-treaters. Candymakers have created "Reindeer Corn" for Christmas, "Cupid Corn" for Valentine's Day and "Bunny Corn" for Easter.

More candy corn kernels:

- 35+ million pounds are produced each year about 9 billion pieces that, if laid end to end, could circle the moon nearly four times.
- George Renninger of the Wunderlee Candy Co. invented candy corn in the 1880s. It was popularized and linked to Halloween by Goelitz Confectionery Co., in 1898.
- Brach's, today's leading candy corn producer, makes 30+ million kernels per day in June, its peak production month.
- The average 1-pound bag of candy corn contains 294 kernels.



Candy Corn's Cousin

While cándy corn is the classic sweet this time of year, its cousin, the candy pumpkin, is another popular choice. Fans who favor the confection say its squashy shape and larger size yield a creamy texture and intense flavor.
